GET REGISTERED NOW FOR PROJECT DOMINICANA, JUNE 15-24



It's not too late, but the trip is filling up. We are recruiting people from a local medical school and from the community, so it is important to get your application in as soon as possible. Project Dominicana is LCPC's mission to Haitian immigrants living in the Dominican Republic. Now in its 17th year, this experience has been life-changing for many adults and high school students.

This year's trip will give you the opportunity to strengthen friendships and continue work that is touching the lives of the very poor. You do not have to be part of the LCPC family to participate, but you should be a person who is seeking to know more about Jesus. This 10-day trip includes opportunities



to work with a construction team building houses in a poor barrio and work with a medical team who is bringing mobile health clinics to people who live in poverty in the La Romana area of the Dominican Republic, mostly Haitian immigrants.

PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear friends, We talked, debated and prayed for many months about the LCPC strategic plan. At the end of November the Session officially

adopted the plan, called "All Eyes on God: Vision 2020." And since January, our church family has been working the plan. We will continue to do so through December 2020.

The vision is bold. God prompted us to establish many big goals. You can read about them on the one-page summary of the plan that was mailed to the congregation. It will be posted on the LCPC website and will be available in paper form at LCPC for anyone who wants one.

Please pray for LCPC as we follow the Spirit's lead and implement the plan. You might use the summary of the plan to guide your prayers.

One thing I would like to emphasize is that while the plan is not vague, it also does not spell out exactly how or when we are going to proceed. For example, the plan specifies that we will upgrade/modernize the lighting, sound and video technology in the Chapel, Fireside Room, Koopmans Hall, and the Sanctuary, and that we will do so at moderate levels of spending. But we now need to work with both volunteers and contractors to design effective, user-friendly systems and install them. I anticipate that we will make good progress on those projects over the next six months.

You can expect to see rapid progress (possibly this month) on two particular projects. The network PC computer system used by the staff is aging. (For those who are into such things: our system operates on Windows 7 which will no longer be serviced by Microsoft after this year. And the PCs aren't powerful enough to upgrade to Windows 10.) So we're on the verge of replacing the network and switching over to more cloud-based services.

Also, we have known for many years that the tan-colored outdoor decking above the two courtyards of the Christian Education building is wearing out. It is now at the end of its useful life so we can't ignore the problem. Very soon we will hire a contractor to replace the waterproof layer and the plywood below. Thankfully, we have already repaired all the structural boards that had been damaged by water. That happened when we repainted the church.

Over the next several months we also expect to make rapid progress on two of our major mission projects.

We will ramp up our efforts to build the Casa de Los Angeles Orphanage in Rosarito, Mexico. The team that will be in Baja this month over Presidents' Day weekend will help to build a large bunker that will serve as a highly secure storage

area (first for construction supplies and tools and later for orphanage gear). Then contractors from Rosarito will build the concrete floor of the second story. Then two more LCPC teams will begin the wood construction of the second and third floors. A big youth team (including students from Glendale Presbyterian Church) will be there over spring break, and a group of men (the Mission MX/Men's Retreat team) will be there the first weekend in May.



Meanwhile, the momentum is building for Hispaniola Partners in the Dominican Republic. This year, for the first time, our June outreach will include at least 10 nursing and medical students and faculty members from the Charles Drew School of Medicine. While our enhanced medical team is offering remedial health care, our construction team (including many youth) will build two more houses for poor families in the Kilometer 6 barrio outside of La Romana. The longer-term goal, probably achievable by year's end, will be to fully outfit and staff the Hispaniola Partners Mission House in La Romana so we can begin to receive mission teams in 2020.

How can you help? What can you do to engage with the plan and find your place in it?

The clear answer is: Come to the Town Hall Meetings that will be offered throughout the year by the Session, staff and key leaders. They will all be held on Sunday evenings, 6:30-8:00 PM in the Sanctuary. The dates for the first four meetings will be February 10, March 10, April 7, and May 19. Each meeting will spotlight a different area of the plan: "Strategies for Reaching Our Neighbors," "Outreach Through Digital Media," "Construction and Technology," and much more. We'll hear exciting, multi-media presentations. We'll engage in conversation and share ideas. We'll seek the Lord's guidance and blessing. Please plan to be there!

I'll be sharing with you much more about "Vision 2020" over the months ahead. God is moving. Let's follow His lead and seek the unity of the Spirit as we work his good plan.

Also before the throne there was what looked like a sea of glass, clear as crystal. In the center, around the throne, were four living creatures, and they were covered with eyes, in front and



in back. The first living creature was like a lion, the second was like an ox, the third had a face like a man, the fourth was like a flying eagle. Each of the four living creatures had six wings and was covered with eyes all around, even under his wings. Day and night they never stop saying: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty, who was, and is, and is to come." (Revelation 4:6-8)

In this scene from Revelation we see the first description of the worship in heaven. The symbolism combines elements of Isaiah's vision (Isaiah 6) and Ezekiel's vision (Ezekiel 1). These four beasts represent the animal kingdom. The lion represents the king of the beasts, the ox is the largest of the tame beasts, and the eagle is the king of birds. Lastly humans are part of the created order. And all the created order gives praise in its own way. Even the animal kingdom is represented in the heavenly worship scene.

But after this, humans give praise to the one who sits on the throne.

Whenever the living creatures give glory, honor and thanks to him who sits on the throne and who lives for ever and ever. the twenty-four elders fall down before him who sits on the throne, and worship him who lives for ever and ever. They lay their crowns before the throne and say: 11 "You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and bonor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they were created and have their being." (Revelation 4:9-11)

When the humans give praise, they use their capacity to reason. "You are worthy...for you created all things..."

Worship is a powerful thing. It's what humans were made to do. Worship provides the context for all of human life. If your world feels out of balance or out of control, worship is the thing that will help you make sense of the craziness of life.
